



## Senior Girls - Summer Uniform: Terms 1 and 4

Year 9 are currently studying chemistry and how it affects our lives. The students recently have been working with indicators and how we can determine if a colourless solution is an acid or base. One such means is to use litmus paper. Blue litmus paper will turn red in the presence of an acid, while red litmus paper will turn blue in the presence of a base.





Chemists study the properties of materials and how they react. This means they play an important role in developing new material and helping engineers make sensible choices for a product's intended function. The students in 9.5 and 9.6 have been looking at pacemakers and comparing how the materials in modern pacemakers differ significantly to designs from 20+ years ago. Students were then asked if there have been any new material developments which we might be able to substitute into pacemakers and justify why such material would make a better product.

Year 7 have recently been studying the solar system and how the Universe around us works; taking in the appearance of the natural systems in space unaffected by human influence. Furthermore, Year 7 noted the effects of our orbit around the Sun giving rise to the seasons and the Moon's orbit around us influencing the tides.



### Season 3 Rep Sport:

All the best to our Season 3 teams who have now played their first few rounds in either Basketball, Cricket or Oz-tag. This season continues into Term 4 and all students have been issued with a jersey to wear for each game and for the duration of the Season. As per College policy, this is not to be worn to school. Students are to get changed at lunch time and it must be returned at the conclusion of the Season. Failing to do so will result in an applicable fee of \$50. A reminder that students must have boots to take the field for Oz-tag.

#### **Thursday Sport:**

All students have now selected a Sport for Term 4. Sport begins on the first Thursday back in Week 1 of Term 4.

On the first day back of Term 4, students in Flipout, Cables or Gym/Fitness will be required to collect a waiver that must be returned on the first Thursday of Term, as per the requirements of the venue. Without this, a student will be unable to participate.

It is an expectation that students return back to school from external sports. No student should be collected from a venue as all venue sport buses return back to school prior to the afternoon buses and therefore students are able to depart the College via their normal arrangements.

# From the Office

### LATE TO SCHOOL

#### From the Diocese

Child Protection Information Line - Royal Commission – The Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta has established a Child Protection Information Line in response to the Royal Commission into Institutional Child Sexual Abuse. The dedicated Information Line will provide information about how schools are handling child protection matters and will be able to respond to individual enquiries and assist people who have concerns or help them take allegations to the police. ## STUDENTS TAKING LEAVE DURING THE SCHOOL TERM

If parents are wishing their son/daughter to take leave during the school term a Leave Form must be completed. Forms are available from the Front Office or if parents would like a form emailed to them, please contact the College Office.

Leave forms are for any length of time.

There are two types of Leave Form:

- (i) for Travel only and
- (ii) all other types of leave. Students will then receive an Exemption Approval letter from the Principal.

10 weeks written or emailed notice from parents/ carers prior to student leaving advising where student will be attending or working.
