One Body, Many Parts - Year 11 Retreat theme 2018

Now you are Christ's body, and individually parts of it. -1 Corinthians 12:27

Recently I commuted into the city for a Principal meeting and travelling on the 'city circle line' I recognised it was the perfect place for peoplewatching. As I got off at Martin Place station and made my way through the busy tunnel walkway I noticed a woman who looked rather tired and disheveled pushing a pram amongst the crowds of people with her child. Near me were two well dressed women in a hurry to get to work no doubt. The woman with the pram asked them and the passing crowd, "Can you spare some change". It's a question that we hear more and more nowadays, and it is alarming and disconcerting. I remember feeling a great sense of sadness and guilt particularly as the women continued past her without even raising an eyelid as though it was the norm and she was non-existent.

In the first letter to the Corinthians, St. Paul writes, "As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ. If one part suffers, all the parts suffer with it; if one part is honoured, all the parts share its joy." The mother and her baby, the women at Martin Place, and all those who are a part of our community of friends and family are of one body. As stated in Lumen Gentium, "By communicating his Spirit, Christ made his brothers, called together from all nations, mystically the components of his own body. In that body the life of Christ is poured into the believers who, through the sacraments, are united in a hidden and real way to Christ who suffered and was glorified." We live as one with Christ and with one another even amidst the poverty, injustice, and messiness we often experience.

This letter from Paul to the early Church deepens our understanding of the Body of Christ and its physical makeup. Each person has a function within it which works alongside the other members of our community and promotes the common good. One of my previous Principals once said to me, "Our goal is always to be present and to connect with others even if it's uncomfortable, we are made to be relational, this is good and right".

In all circumstances, the Body of Christ leads us to a holier life. When we are doubtful or uncertain, our faith community allows us to grow. When we are overwhelmed, others will kindle the fire of faith within us and pick us up and give us hope. I was privileged to experience all of the above along with a great sense of pride and joy when visiting the Year 11 Retreat centres last week. The students were all challenged to be part of our Emmaus community through their unique identity and authenticity and to share this with their peers, just as Christ did. They were called to be the many parts that make up the one body.

I found myself pausing the day of my visits to Year 11 because of the mystical experience of community that I was able to witness. The disturbing vision of the pain of the poor mother and child at Martin Place, and the harshness of the response of the women and others around made me more aware of this truth of being connected to all people as demonstrated by Year 11 on retreat. St. Paul outlines this for us, and we hear it in St. Teresa of Avila's words, "Yours are the hands, yours are the feet, yours are the eyes, you are his body. Christ has no body now on earth but yours." We must pay attention to each other like Jesus did, and love all our brothers and sisters just as we love ourselves".

I congratulate Year 11 and the teachers who attended the three day retreat and continue to extend this question for reflection to them along with all our school community: What unique gifts can I share with others as a member of the Body of Christ? How can I become more aware of the communities I live in?

Year 11 Retreat


In Week 2 from the 1st to the 3rd August, Year 11 were fortunate to attend their first Senior Retreat at Emmaus. The grade went to three different venues but were connected by a common theme – One body, Many parts.

Over the three days students participated in many activities which allowed them to reflect on themselves and explore ways each of them join together to form a community in Christ. One student's reflection reveals the deep impact the retreat had on them and the group as a whole. "At retreat we shared many experiences and learnt new things about one another that we never knew before. We had moments of laughter, joy, and were unified as a group as we shared experiences and opened up to our fellow peers."









At the end of retreat, it was heart-warming to see students read through affirmations that others had written about them and to see a genuine appreciation for what others see in them. One student happily shared, "I feel I can speak on behalf of my group, that the retreat was a moving and enlightening experience which brought so many of us closer together and bonding with those whom we weren't that close to. All in all, it was a great retreat and it couldn't have come at a better time, before our toughest year ahead, for our group to form a family." This is a really uplifting part of the retreat and is something students should hold dear for many years as it will remind them of what they can contribute to any community.

Information for Parents

What is happening? In preparation for NAPLAN Online in 2019, all CEDP schools will complete a NAPLAN Online Readiness Test in Term 3 of 2018. The school readiness test is a 'practice run' for schools to assess their technology ahead of NAPLAN Online. The readiness test is not an assessment of student ability.

When and where is this happening? The NAPLAN Readiness test will take place between 20 August and 7 September 2018 at your child's school.

Who will be involved? Student in grades three, five, seven and nine from each CEDP school will complete this test.





How should I prepare my child for the NAPLAN Online School Readiness Test? Your child will not need any academic preparation for the school readiness test. This is not a test of their literacy and numeracy skills, but an opportunity for them to experience the online test format and for their school to assess its online testing capability. If parents would like to familiarise themselves and their children with the look and feel of the NAPLAN online test a public demonstration site with sample questions are available.

and numeracy is required for your child to receive their Higher School Certificate (HSC).



Meeting the HSC minimum standard will mean that your child has the literacy and numeracy skills that are essential for success in learning and life after school.

THE ONLINE TESTS

Most students will show they have met the HSC minimum standard by passing minimum standard online tests. Students master basic skills at different stages so there are **multiple opportunities** available to pass the tests, from Year 10 until a few years after Year 12.



There are three 45-minute online tests:

- a multiple choice **reading** test
- a multiple choice **numeracy** test
- a short **writing** test based on a choice between a visual or written prompt

2017 NAPLAN TESTS

If your child achieved Band 8s or above in one or more of the 2017 Year 9 NAPLAN tests they are recognised as having met the HSC minimum standard in that area/s and will not need to sit the corresponding online test/s.

(Applies to our current Year 10 students)

STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

Some students with disabilities will be eligible for extra provisions for the minimum standard online tests, or an exemption from the HSC minimum standard requirement.

Students are encouraged to talk to their teachers to determine whether they are eligible for provisions. A Disability Provisions, Exemptions and Appeals policy, which contains further information, is available on the NESA website.

There are two types of Leave Form:


