Recent Student Leadership forum with CEDP

66 student leaders from schools around the Diocese of Parramatta recently came together on Thursday, June 20 for a Leadership Forum to explore the future of the Catholic Church and the role that young people play as agents of change.

Congratulation to Holly Burgess in Year 7



Religious Education

On Friday 28th June, 36 students from Years 7, 8, 10, 11 and 12 attended the annual St Vincent de Paul Winter Sleep Out.

The afternoon began with careful preparation and assistance from students who were so enthusiastic about the event that they didn't even go home to get ready! A light snack was shared along with a friendly game of basketball before the Amazing Race around the school began. With their extensive knowledge of the College, students cleverly unravelled the clues. They certainly were challenged when Mr Nastasi sheltered from the cold in the Mercy Chapel with his clue. The Year 12's showed their six years of ECC knowledge and were back in the Sister Patricia Tully Centre first to be named the winning team. After waiting for a team of Year 8's with a non-defeatist attitude, we were finally able to get down to the reason for the event – what should be important in our lives for the good of all, particularly for those in great need.

Students identified their needs for one day and sorted them into resources and tasks. They then assessed whether they would be able to carry these out or not if they were homeless. Expanding on this was the learning about different types of homelessness. For example, living on the streets or in tents, living in overcrowded dwellings, supported accommodation, with others or in boarding houses. Students were finally challenged to take action and think creatively about how they might be able to help the homeless. One suggested strategy was to break down barriers and overcome one's own and others' judgements around the reasons that people are homeless. The Gospel passage from Matthew, The Final Judgement that was used in the liturgy, asked us to reflect on how we want to be judged when we leave this world. In order to be ready to meet God, we need to let go of our own judgements of the homeless and treat every person with dignity, no matter what they look like, what they have or haven't done. We need to see God in the face of these people and be Christ for them. It isn't good enough for us to stand back and wait for someone else to do it - we need to do it.

Students' attendance at the Sleep Out and experience then of sleeping in cardboard shelters that they had created, on the cold hard floor of the Hall, with only a simple meal of soup and bread, and without showering, all contributed to being able to empathise in a small way with the plight of those who for whatever reason live this life every night.

Blankets, warm clothes, gift cards and money were generously donated throughout the term and on the evening. These were very much appreciated by Lou and Joan from the St Clair Chapter of St Vincent de Paul who came and shared some of their experiences with us on the evening. These donations will continue to be collected up until the end of the term.

A huge thanks to the wonderful staff of Emmaus who helped make this night possible. Many generous hands contributed by making soup, buying goods, bringing in cardboard, supervising students, organising the activities and sleeping out with the students. Our Emmaus students are very lucky to have teachers who not only lead them in their learning of curriculum but also in their learning about life and being active Christians who contribute to the greater good of all humanity.


Dear Parents/Carers
