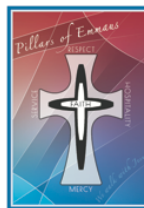

The day comprised of multiple experiments which furthered our understanding of the important insights in Physics, including the most significant Physicists who were the core of Physics itself. 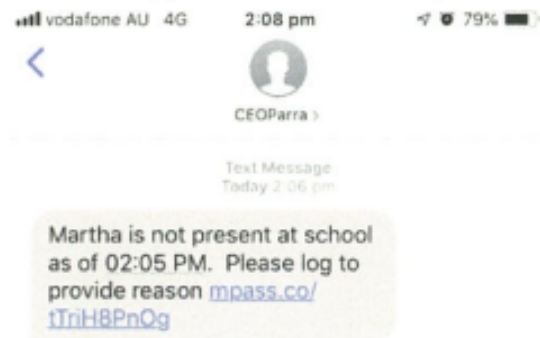


## SMS Messaging
