Over the last few years a number of our students have participated in a capoeira program. This program has been a wonderful way to build appreciation and understanding of culture and learn some wonderful dance, martial arts and music skills in the process. I have invited three of our Year 11 students to share their experience of attending the 11th STARTTS Capoeira Angola Youth Encounter last week.

On Friday last week we had the opportunity to attend the STARTTS Capoeira Angola Youth Encounter. Some of the highlights were:

- Meeting the visiting capoeira mestres (masters) from New York and Brazil. They shared with us their stories about their upbringings and told us great life lessons, such as life is too valuable to waste. They also told us that in life you can do anything if you set your mind to it! For example, Mestre Jamie is in his 70s and he could do a backflip!
- Seeing the diversity of ages and cultures who participated on the day. There was so much unity and some people travelled a long way to get there! We were able to embrace our culture and that of others. Through our shared experiences we found our common ground in capoeira.
- We met so many new people. Our groups were mixed and this forced us to meet new people and get out of our comfort zones. Some people came from war torn countries with many sad and past traumas, but still continued to smile and didn't let their experiences affect how they treated everyone they encountered on the day. It was a very humbling experience.
- The dance off between the masters at the end of the youth encounter was amazing! They are incredibly talented and we felt really lucky to see them perform.
- Capoeira is an Afro Brazilian martial art movement, it allows individuals to relieve some stress, anger and even traumas. It makes people feel at peace with their mind and body and part of a family. We have found it to be a great program to be part of!

Religious Education

During the school holidays, Mr Yuzon and I embarked on a journey of a lifetime, accompanied by 8 other educators in the Parramatta Diocese.

We travelled to our closest neighbouring country, Timor Leste, with the objective of forming a relationship with the local communities and high schools in the hopes of taking other teachers and students to immerse themselves in the lives, culture, and faith of the Timorese.

Our journey was assisted by Father Luan, a Vietnamese Australian refugee. He has lived in Timor Leste for the past 15 years assisting even the most remote and disadvantaged communities in their well-being and faith.

We journeyed to remote villages, where we slept in bamboo huts with dirt floors, and giant spiders as our roommates. Although we barely had basic necessities, we had never felt more welcomed or accepted into a community. Every village we visited, we were welcomed with smiles, handshakes, and delicious traditional meals.

One of our fondest memories is distributing the donations given to us by our staff - coloured pencils, paper, frisbees and soccer balls. Mr Yuzon and I taught some children as old as 6 or 7 how to hold a pencil, as schooling is not always affordable or accessible for many of the communities. Their smiles and laughter will echo in our minds for the rest of our lives.

The Timorese pride themselves on their service and hospitality, often offering us a week's worth of their own food, just for our lunch. To say that these displays of hospitality was humbling would be a grave understatement.

They are a people driven by their Catholic faith, which provides them with hope and a sense of community that is unparalleled. Being a part of their community will forever remain a part of our identity, and we hope to bring our experiences of joy, hospitality and hope into our classrooms and school community.

We would like to leave you with one last sentiment. During our immersion, we grappled with the fact that we could not solve all of the problems that we saw. And if we could, we would not even know where to begin. Amidst our feelings of helplessness, Father Luan said:

"We are always asking, what can we do for you? What can we buy? What can we fix? When sometimes, all people want is for someone to be there. Sometimes it is enough just to be there."
