Announcements of the new teaching staff joining Emmaus next year will be made in the first newsletter of 2022 and we have been fortunate to secure a group of talented and experienced teachers to join the Emmaus family.

### Conversational (Growth) Coaching to replace homeroom in 2022 and the order of lessons during the day will change

The College embarked on a journey of <u>'Growth Coaching'</u> for academic success in 2021 with a focus on teachers coaching each other to develop strategies to improve their pedagogy and hence support academic success in our students.

To that end we are moving to the next phase of Coaching in 2022 whereby our Homeroom teachers will now be known as 'Conversational Coaches' and they will each take a group of around 20 students in a year group and act as their coach to plan with the individual students their learning, wellbeing and personal goals throughout the year. This model will replace the Homeroom teacher concept, now outdated in its nature where we simply mark a roll and provide notices. Attendance and administration details will continue to be done in other ways particularly given teachers mark rolls each lesson and COMPASS is where we house much of daily information required for both students and families.

As such we have decided as a college to adjust the <u>ORDER</u> of events/lessons in the day to ensure that this coaching takes place at a different time in the student/teacher timetable to remove the old concept of the 12-minute homeroom class and change the mindset of students to arrive for learning as of 8.40am and meeting their conversational coach (CC) at a more conducive time during the day.

I share with you the <u>new daily times</u> for the students knowing that start and finish times remain the same and hence will not impact on arrival/departure and travel/buses times. It will however mean that students will now *begin the day with period 1 at 8.40am* and thus the onus on them and families to ensure being on time all the time, as late arrival will impact on key course learnings during period 1.



### **Religious Education**






### **Congratulations!**

The College is happy to take donated uniforms however due to Work, Health and Safety, we request all uniforms are washed or drycleaned.


